Dear Pleasant Valley Water Member

We are pleased to furnish you with the following information about the water quality and services we provide to our members.

Pleasant Valley Water Company purchases our water from the City of Tillamook as a finished product. The City does all of the filtration and treatment. Pleasant Valley Water collects monthly samples for bacteria levels, yearly samples for Disinfection By-Products and Lead and Copper samples every 3 years. Enclosed is the 2008/2009 Annual Water Quality Report from the Tillamook Water Department containing contaminant test results and other important information about your drinking water.

Water delivery to our Company enters the system from one tap point on the City's mainline at Clemens Corner Road and is pumped through our system by two alternating pumps at the Clemens Corner Pump Station. The system is backed up by an 185,000 gallon reservoir on Fawcett Creek Road, which gravity feeds back into the system.

08/09 was a very full year for the Board and those involved with the day to day operation of the system.

Among some of the things accomplished in 08/09 were:

~A 6" line extension from Clemens Corner heading west along South Prairie Road was completed to form a "loop" to keep the south half of our system in service in case of emergency. We were very fortunate to have this loop completed when the catastrophe at Fawcett Creek on South Prairie Road took place on November 12th.

~A new hydrant was installed at the South Prairie Road / Rocky Road Intersection

~The Cross Connection Plan, which as of Jan. 31, 2006 is required by the State for community water systems with 15 or more service connections (we have 243) continues to be fine tuned.

~We applied for a USDA Grant to fund the repair at the Fawcett Creek washout which took out about 100' of our 8" AC Mainline. The board met with USDA shortly after the washout, and anticipated that we would have the line bored under Fawcett Creek and back online by the end of March. Unfortunately this timeline was not met, and we completed the temporary bypass on 5/26.

~Met with ODOT to identify all of the 101 crossings for the roadwork that will be taking place this summer.

~Had our intake meter at Clemens Corner calibrated.

- ~Took first ever AC samples as a requirement for the USDA grant. (clean)
- ~ Completed and passed the yearly DHS survey of our system on 12/4/2008
- ~ Received word from USDA on 5/14 “Congrats, you are approved for the grant...”
- ~We had 7 new hookups into the system

We have several goals for 2009/2010, including:

- ~Finishing up the USDA grant, and get the permanent line installed at the washout.
- ~Starting the process of getting a second reservoir at the top of Munson Creek Road. This will involve another grant or low-interest loan.
- ~Repairing both ends of the bridge over Fawcett Creek on Fawcett Creek Road.
- ~Continuing to locate and map “unknown” lines
- ~Finish up and put into effect the Cross Connection Control program.

We invite you to attend our quarterly board meetings, held the last Wed. of the first month of each quarter, in the Carl Rawe Meeting Room at Tillamook PUD, 1115 Pacific Ave. in Tillamook. Meetings are at 7:00 pm.
